## Asian Cycling Confederation Delivers Major Advancements at ACC Management Committee Meeting

*Bidding Awards, Governance Updates, and Youth Development Initiatives Announced at  
Landmark Meeting in Kuala Lumpur*

**KUALA LUMPUR, MALAYSIA – 21 April** – The **Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC)**, under the leadership of President **Dato' Amarjit Singh Gill**, successfully concluded the **ACC Management Committee Meeting** held at **The Intercontinental Hotel Kuala Lumpur**.

The event brought together key stakeholders from across Asia to finalize championship bids, strengthen governance, and unveil new initiatives for the development of cycling from grassroots to elite levels.

One of the most significant announcements of the meeting was the awarding of host nations for the **2026 and 2027 Asian Cycling Championships**, covering five core disciplines:

### 2026 Championships

- **Road Cycling:** Saudi Arabia
- **Track Cycling:** Philippines
- **Mountain Bike (MTB):** Uzbekistan
- **BMX Racing:** Malaysia
- **Trials:** Iran

### 2027 Championships

- **Road Cycling:** China
- **Track Cycling:** Malaysia
- **Mountain Bike (MTB):** Japan
- **BMX Racing:** Thailand
- **Trials:** Iran

These selections reflect ACC's strategic efforts to ensure equal opportunities and balanced regional development, empowering a broader cycling ecosystem across the continent and also to ensure awarding of host countries are done well in advance.

To support sustainable growth, the ACC approved a **revised organisational fee structure across all disciplines**. The new model aims to reflect the current changes and the value of the major events in the Continent while maintaining high standards for event delivery and administration.

Furthermore, the meeting confirmed the **election of substitute voting delegates to UCI Congress** to fill in the vacancy which was left during the ACC Congress held on 6 February in Bangkok, Thailand. across member nations. The elections through postal email will take place on 16 May.

The Management Committee also confirmed the appointments of the **Presidents and Member of the various ACC Commission** who will play an active role in ensuring the progress of the Sport. A total of 17 Commissions were formed and ACC Management Committee is confident that the President of the Commission together with its members will play a significant role to assist the Administration

ACC Management Committee also unanimously made it **mandatory for all winners of the Asian Championships to wear the official Asian Champion Jersey during relevant competitions.**

*“This is a matter of pride, recognition, and unity. The jersey is not just a uniform — it’s a badge of excellence. Every Asian champion deserves to be seen and celebrated as a continental symbol of achievement.”* said **ACC President Dato’ Amarjit Singh Gill.**

In an exciting move for youth cycling, ACC has agreed to launch the **first-ever Asian Balance Bike (Push Bike) Championship in Thailand.** This initiative targets children between the ages of 2 to 6 years and is designed to encourage early engagement with cycling in a safe and fun environment.

*“If we want to build a future in cycling, we must start with our youngest. This championship will be a joyful start for many children and a stepping stone toward discovering future champions. It reflects our belief in development that begins at the grassroots.”* added Dato’ Amarjit Singh who is also Member of the UCI Management Committee.

The Committee also **approved list of Continental Solidarity Projects for Asia** aiming at arming the Asian National Federations with more administrative and technical input.

Wrapping up the session, the President reflected on the achievements of the ACC MC Meeting :

*“This meeting was not just about events — it was about building the future. Every decision we made reflects our shared vision of **OneAsia**: to elevate Asia’s position in global cycling, to invest in our youth, and to strengthen the cycling community across every corner of our continent.”*

*“With unity and collaboration, Asia is well on its way to becoming a global powerhouse in the sport.”*
