Asia to Host Multiple UCI Track World Cup Rounds and UCI BMX Racing World Cup *Showcasing Asia's Leading Role in Global Cycling*

Kuala Lumpur, 23 August 2025 – The Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC) proudly welcomes the announcement by the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) that Asia has been awarded multiple rounds of the **UCI Track World Cup** and will also feature prominently as a venue for the **UCI BMX Racing World Cup** for the 2026–2028 seasons.

Under the newly unveiled calendars, Asia will stage consecutive Track World Cup rounds in **Hong Kong (2026, 2027), Malaysia (2026), and China (2027, 2028)**, while **China** will also host key rounds of the BMX Racing World Cup for the very first time.

These awards underline the growing importance of Asia as a global hub for cycling, offering world-class facilities, passionate fans, and strong government support across the continent.

ACC President, Dato' Amarjit Singh Gill commented that:

"This is a historic moment for Asian cycling. To see Asia entrusted with multiple rounds of both the UCI Track World Cup and the UCI BMX Racing World Cup reflects the confidence the UCI has in our region's ability to deliver world-class events. Asia is no longer just a participant in world cycling – we are now a leading stage."

"Hosting these events in Hong Kong, Malaysia, China, and beyond will inspire a new generation of Asian cyclists while giving our athletes the opportunity to compete at home against the best in the world. It also strengthens our pathway to the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic Games."

"On behalf of the Asian Cycling Confederation, I extend our deepest gratitude to the UCI President and the UCI Management Committee for their trust and vision. Together, we will continue to elevate cycling in Asia and ensure that our continent plays a defining role in the global growth of the sport. China, in particular, is playing an increasingly important role, not only by hosting these prestigious events but also by investing in facilities and nurturing young talent."

In the Track discipline, Asia will take centre stage with Hong Kong hosting rounds in **April 2026** and again in **April 2027**, while Malaysia will welcome the world to the **National Velodrome in Nilai from 24–26 April 2026**. China will further strengthen its presence by hosting Track World Cup rounds in **2027 (30 April–2 May)** and **2028 (7–9 April)**. On the BMX Racing side, China will feature as a World Cup host, with rounds scheduled in **October 2026, April 2027, and March 2028**.
